Asenze is a Research Project located in the Centre for Rural Health within the School of Nursing and Public Health at the University of KwaZulu-Natal with partners including the University of Columbia and National Institutes of Health (NIH). This study will focus on adolescents and the interrelationships between the development of risky behaviours (drug and alcohol misuse and unprotected sex) and the development of executive function in the context of early and ongoing adversity, and the role of family support. The focus will be on these interrelationships with a view to identifying both early and concurrent determinants of adolescent risk and resilience that will contribute to the development of effective preventive and supportive interventions.

The Research Project Manager who will work as part of a multi-disciplinary team to manage project activities and liaise with project partners and will be responsible for coordinating the activities of the Asenze Research Project in 5 districts within the Valley of 1000 Hills, KwaZulu-Natal.
