- Ability to teach in one or more of the following areas: African Criminology, Forensic, Criminology, Restorative Justice and Victimology
- Evidence of quality lecturing and teaching experience at tertiary level.

**Minimum Requirements: Senior Lecturer**

- A doctoral degree in criminology or related field
- Evidence of an appropriate research and publication record (e.g. DoHET) accredited publications, books, chapters, conference proceedings, etc
- Evidence of successful postgraduate suasion at the masters and /or doctoral levels
- Ability to teach in two or more of the following areas: African Criminology, Forensic Criminology, Restorative Justice and Victimology
- Evidence of at least five (5) years quality lecturing and teaching experience in criminology or related field at tertiary level.
