- At least seven years post-PhD research and/or teaching experience in Social Work at university level;
- A record of at least four successful supervision of doctoral candidates to completion ;
- Evidence of excellence in Research, Teaching, and Community Engagement;
- Evidence of at least 3 years senior leadership experience in academic and/or administration and management ;
- Evidence of substantial research grant applications commensurate to the level of Full Professor; and
- Evidence of registration or eligibility to register with the South African Council for Social Service Professions.

- A doctoral qualification in Social Work;
- Evidence of peer-reviewed publications commensurate to the level of Associate Professor ;
- At least five years post-PhD research and teaching experience in social work at the university level;
- Evidence of successful postgraduate research supervision at Masters level and at least two successful doctoral supervision to completion since last appointed a Senior Lecturers;
- Evidence of excellence in at least two of the following categories: research, teaching, community engagement, academic administration
- Experience in supervision of Social Work field practice education;
- Evidence of registration or eligibility to register with the South African Council for Social Service Professions.

- A doctoral qualification in Social Work;
- At least three years' post-PhD teaching experience in social work at university level;
- Evidence of successful undergraduate and postgraduate research supervision commensurate to the level of Senior Lecturer ;

- Evidence of peer-reviewed publications commensurate to the level of Senior Lecturer
- Evidence of registration or eligibility to register with the South African Council for Social Service Professions.
