The School of Built Environment and Development Studies seeks to appoint a Lecturer to teach, train, supervise, and provide academic leadership within the Discipline of Planning. The successful candidates will be expected to build a national profile as a professional planning educator, lecture to postgraduate students; contribute to the academic and management functions of the discipline and the School; conduct and publish research, as well as raise the profile of the discipline with the professional community of planners in South Africa and abroad. A minimum requirement for the Senior Lecturer post is both a coursework master degree in Town Planning and a doctorate in Planning and a minimum requirement for the lecturer post is a coursework Masters Degree in Planning. All applicants must have a Masters Degree in Planning and an active registration with SACPLAN. The following are specific requirements for each of the levels:

Lecturer

- Masters Degree by coursework in Town Planning; [L] [SEP]
- Professional registration or eligibility for registration as a professional planner with SACPLAN;
- Teaching, supervision or research experience of at least 3 years at tertiary [L] [SEP] or research institution (preferably at the postgraduate level);
- Current PhD registration in an accredited university or eligibility of registration for a PhD degree in Planning;
- A research plan that links planning theory and practice to [L] [SEP] engage undergraduate and postgraduate students; and [L] [SEP]
- Evidence of appropriate research and publication record. [L] [SEP]
- Evidence of teaching and research expertise in [L] [SEP] the following areas of planning theory and practice:

 - ✓ Environmental Planning & Management

- ✓ Geographic Information Systems (GIS)
- ✓ Integrated Development Planning
- ✓ Layout and Subdivision
