As team players, candidates will lead or contribute towards the effort to develop holistic, theoretical and applied African criminology and all its interrelated facets, in line with the vision and mission of the University of KwaZulu-Natal. Successful candidates may also be required to assume academic coordination responsibilities in the School.

**MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS: LECTURER**

- A Masters' degree in criminology or related field but preferably a doctorate in criminology or related field;
- Evidence of an emerging publication record or conference presentations/participation in research activities or evidence of industrial/field experience in Criminology/Forensics;
- Participation in research projects or research related activities (for example, research conference attendance);
- Ability to teach in one or more of the following areas: African Criminology, Forensic Criminology, Restorative Justice and Victimology and
- Evidence of quality lecturing and teaching experience at tertiary level.

## **SENIOR LECTURER**

- A doctoral degree in criminology or related field;
- Evidence of an appropriate research and publication record (e.g. DoHET accredited publications, books, chapters, conference proceedings, etc.);
- Evidence of successful postgraduate supervision at the masters and/or doctoral levels;
- Ability to teach in two or more of the following areas: African Criminology, Forensic Criminology, Restorative Justice and Victimology and
- Evidence of at least five (5) years quality lecturing and teaching experience in criminology or related field at tertiary level.
